

Winston-Salem State University Doctor of Physical Therapy Program Clinical Education Faculty Rights and Privileges

The clinical education faculty of WSSU DPT program have the following rights and privileges:

- 1. The right to receive information regarding students and their previous experiences, learning styles, and any specific needs.
- 2. The right to review the curricular sequence and placement of the clinical internships in the DPT curriculum.
- 3. The right to receive assistance from the school with questions regarding student supervision/reimbursement issues.
- 4. The right to request individual inservices on issues specific to clinical education or relative topics given at your site. Please contact Dr. Jennifer Martin at martinjg@wssu.edu to discuss this option.
- 5. The right to access free CI training modules given by WSSU faculty. Please contact Dr. Jennifer Martin at martinig@wssu.edu to gain access to these modules.
- 6. The right to request instruction and feedback for the web Clinical Performance Instrument (CPI).
- 7. The right to request library privileges by contacting the Director of Clinical Education (DCE). Please email Dr. <u>Jennifer Martin at martinig@wssu.edu</u> to receive information to get your access established.
- 8. The right to receive an invitation to attend the WSSU DPT Research Day. Please call 336-750-8602 to receive an invitation.
- 9. The right to receive an invitation for your entire staff to the annual <u>Carolina Clinical</u> <u>Education Consortium (CCEC)</u> continuing education seminar. Each year the seminar pertains to clinical and teaching skills to be used in the clinic, as well as offering the basic <u>APTA CI Credentialing Program (CIECP) course.</u>
- 10. The right to receive or request a phone interview or site visit from the DCE during the clinical internships.
- 11. The right to request a termination of the student from your site if the student is performing in an unsafe, unprofessional manner, or not meeting mutual expectations (school, student, or site).
- 12. The right to request withdrawal of the student if requested disability accommodations cannot be met or requests were not communicated prior to beginning of the internship.
